Frequently Asked Questions

A new portal for Access Dental Plan (ADP) Medi-Cal LAPHP and GMC members is coming in January 2024. We've listed some common questions and answers to help with the transition.

- Q. When will the new portal be available?
- A. The new portal will be available January 15, 2024.
- Q. What are the new portal features?
- A. The new portal will allow you to quickly get information on your own instead of calling us. In the new portal, you will be able to:
 - View, download, and print your plan ID card (New!)
 - Connect through your mobile device (New!)
 - See your referrals (New!)
 - Find a dentist (if you don't already have one) or change your dentist
 - See your benefits and coverage
 - See your authorizations, claims, and more
 - Get plan documents and resources (e.g., member handbooks)
- Q. How can I access the new portal? Will this affect my current login?
- A. You will access the new portal on the same website you use today,

www.premierlife.com/camedicaid.

You will need to create a new login. Your username on the new portal will be your primary email address. Have your Access Dental ID card ready to set up your new login.

- Q. How do I get my Access Dental ID card or member ID number so I can register?
- A. You will need your member ID to register. Your member ID is printed on your Access Dental ID card and Medi-Cal Benefits Identification Card (BIC).
- Q. Can I connect my family members into one account?
- A. Yes, the new member portal will link your dependents / family members that are under age 18.
- Q. When will I receive more information on the new portal?
- A. We'll send you more information in Dec 2023 to get you started. You can also check the website <u>www.premierlife.com/camedicaid</u> in January 2024 for help.
